Vienna: the winners were selected during the young formwork builder competition held by the Professional Building Academy Association, Vienna Office. The Upper Austrian ALPINE team and its apprentices, Bernard Feischl and Florian Huber, demonstrated their formwork skills and won third place. Apprentices in their last formwork apprenticeship year from the states of Vienna, Burgenland, Upper Austria, Lower Austria and Salzburg fought for victory. An abutment was formed with a wing wall at an angle of 135° and a recess with miter cut. The dimensional accuracy was rated to the millimeter.
